

SUMMARY OF TRIALS IN CUBA

The *FDP Center for Incidents Reporting* informs that, as of the date of preparation of this document, at least **436 common trials** have been held in Cuba (386 men, 49 women and one unidentified victim), related to the social mobilizations that occurred in the country in 2021.

The sanctions received by the victims are:

- **Limitation of freedom**, with sanctions between 3-5 years: 3 people (all men).
- **Provisional prison with partial dismissal**: One man with a 15-year sentence, one man with an 18-year sentence, two men with 20-year sentences.
- **Deprivation of liberty**: Sanctions between 1-30 years, up to 411 people (363 men, 47 women, one unidentified person).
- **Deprivation of liberty, with Correctional Work with Internment**: 1 man, with a sentence of 5 years.
- **Correctional Work Without Internment**: 5 men, sentenced between 3-5 years.
- **Correctional Work with Internment**: 11 people (2 women, 9 men), with sentences between 1-10 years.
- **The sanction is unknown**: 1 person.

At least **47 people** have been sentenced in summary trials (17 women and 30 men).

50 people have been released without criminal charges (4 women and 46 men).

According to the Justicia 11-J group, **there would be 125 sentences already available to date.**

It must be considered that the 5 main charges imputed to the victims are:

- Public disorder: 572 people.
- Contempt: 318 people.
- Attack: 300 people.
- Sedition: 168 people with charges against State Security.
- Instigation to commit a crime: 116 people.

SITUATION OF MINORS

There is special concern for the 51 minors (between 12-17 years old) who were detained and are being currently accused.

16 adolescents aged between 16-17 years old are accused of sedition, and 13 of them have already been tried.

The FDP Center for Incidents Reporting made an Urgent Appeal to the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights (IACHR), requesting:

- To demand the release of all political prisoners, especially minors who remain behind bars.
- To firmly condemn the Cuban authorities for human rights violations in Cuba.
- With all of the above, to request that you be able to request information on this matter from the State of Cuba, and make a public pronouncement about it, as UNICEF has done in recent days.
